**Exhibition Headline: Edward Weston, 1920-1942: Selections From the Humboldt Corporate Group Collection**

Known as one of the most influential American photographers of the Twentieth Century, Edward Weston's work has had a profound effect on photography today. Loaned from the Humboldt Corporate Group Collection, this exhibition features selections from some of Weston's most well-known series as well as some rare images. Focusing on his stylistic changes and the influence of his location on his work, the exhibition illustrates his Emerging Style in Glendale and Ohio, his New Visions in Mexico and L.A., and Moving to Carmel and Modernism.

The Morris Graves Museum of Art, located at 636 F Street, Eureka is open to the public noon-5p.m., Wednesday through Sunday. Museum admission is by donation: \$4 for adults, \$1 for seniors age 55 and older; HAC Members and children age 12 and under are admitted free.
