New at the Morris Graves Museum of Art Gift Shop is a newly release CD by Singer/Songwriter Kay Rose, "Words Left Unsaid". Kay Rose will appear at the Morris Graves Art Museum for the First Saturday Night's Arts Alive! on Saturday, February 2nd between 6 and 9pm. The singer/songwriter will be doing a solo performance in celebration of her long awaited, independently released first CD, which she says is appropriately named "Words Left Unsaid".

This beautifully produced CD is an impressive collection of songs that are heart felt and introspective, with melodies that linger on in your mind long after you have heard them. The singer says that the record is a bit of an archive of her own life, which has been a roller coaster ride through love and loss, as depicted in the hauntingly beautiful first cut, "The Old Oak Tree". But it is mostly a journey through life experiences that can be related to by many. Though reaching emotional depths, it is also laced throughout with lots of optimism, encouragement, and reflections on what is really important in life. The tender title song, "Words Left Unsaid", speaks of finding the words to let others know what is really in your heart.

The album gains additional luster from the playing and co-production of renowned guitarist Jeff Pevar on a number of tunes. Jeff is best known for being a member of CPR, with David Crosby and his son, James Raymond. The songs ride along the great groove of drummer Danny Montgomery, as well as having appearances on some tunes by other veteran Humboldt musicians, including bassists Ken Lawrence and Gary Davidson, and guitarist and artist, Robby Jarvis. Even former Compass Rose band members, Rick Nelson and Jim Hubbard, have an appearance on a light tune called "I Miss You", that the band once performed and they may have long since forgotten about! The moving instrumental reprise of the title song features local area cellist, Anne Conrad-Antoville.

Kay moved from Trinidad to Eugene, Oregon in 2006, where she is pursuing more music endeavors and enjoying being closer to extended family members. But like many, she still considers Humboldt County to be a second home and returns often.
